
**LAUREL CEMETERY (1852-1958)** was a burial ground for thousands of African Americans. Despite protest, the cemetery was demolished, and several burials, monuments, and markers were relocated to Carroll County. A small number were privately moved to other cemeteries. However, the majority of burials remain at this site.

The Laurel Cemetery Memorial Project seeks to create a memorial in recognition of this site, and to research and teach about the rich history of the cemetery and the lives of those buried here.


